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# Job Coach

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- The Job Coach role is to support individuals with or without health conditions or disabilities, to develop their working skills to become successful in competitive employment. My role as Job Coach is not to do their job but to assist them in learning the job and ensuring the job is matched with their needs.
- My role is to support clients and meet regularly with employers and key people in work placement settings i.e. supervisors and co-workers, in order to maintain good communication and address work related issues. It is important to work with individuals during their journey into employment, the Job Coach undertakes reviews with the individual every four weeks, over a 6 month period, once employment has commenced.
- The Job Coach also provides support to the employer ensuring the transition is as smooth as possible, whilst providing appropriate information on disability awareness and Access to Work. There are also opportunities for employers to access training on behalf of their employees, to develop their skills and move on in their careers, for example; National Vocational Qualifications (NVQ).
